RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY 2009

- 1) The New Zealand Arab Horse Breeders' Society Rules for Judging & Showing Arabian Horses 2008 apply to all classes and all sections and will be strictly enforced. Competitors, exhibitors, owners and handlers should familiarise themselves with the rules of this event which are available on request or to download from the NZAHBS website: www.newzealandarabs.com, Resources, PDF Downloads, NZAHBS Rules for Judging & Showing 2008.
- 2) The age of all horses is to be calculated as from 1st August. Every horse foaled before 1st August in any year shall be deemed to be one year old on that date (this includes imported horses).
- 3) Horses to be shown must be registered with the New Zealand Arab Horse Breeders' Society Inc or in the case of foals, be eligible for registration. Eligibility is defined as being: that the sire and dam of the foal are DNA'd at the time of close of entries for the show and that the breeder/exhibitor is, through full and current financial membership of the NZAHBS, eligible to register the foal that is being entered for the show.
- 4) Imported horses may not be shown until New Zealand registration (including DNA information) is completed and a certificate issued.
- 5) All horses shown must be registered with the New Zealand Arab Horse Breeders' Society Inc and exhibited in the name of the bona fide owner or lessee. All leases must be registered with the New Zealand Arab Horse Breeders' Society Inc.

6) **ENTRIES**

Entry Fees must accompany entries, payment accepted by cheque or money order:

For all classes the full NZAHBS registered Name of the Horse, NZAHBS Stud Book Number, Sex, Date of Birth, Breeder, Sire and Dam must appear on the Official Entry Form.

NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED

- 7) **Back Numbers** – a charge of \$10.00 per back number will be made for any back number not returned.
- 8) **Stables** – are to be pre-ordered and pre-paid using the Official Stable Order Form included with the schedule and forwarded to the National Secretary with entry fees.
- 9) **Refunds** – there will be no refund of entry fees in any circumstances, except 75% on presentation of a Doctors/Veterinary Certificate of unfitness on the day of the show. The Doctors/Veterinary Certificate must be forwarded to the National Secretary on or before the day of the show.
- 10) Judging will be in accordance with the New Zealand Arab Horse Breeders' Society Rules for Judging & Showing Arabian Horses 2008.
- 11) The NZAHBS National Show Committee reserves the right to make any alterations to the programme or to postpone or cancel the show or any class as it sees fit. If there are insufficient entries in classes, classes may be combined.
- 12) Exhibitors must be ready to enter the ring when the class is called in catalogue order. No late exhibitors may enter the ring if Judging has commenced.
- 13) Competitors in Derivative Ridden classes must produce a current height certificate on request.
- 14) Horses must be 3 years and over in all Ridden classes.
- 15) Entries in Gelding classes must have been gelded. Registration Certificate to be produced on request.

- 16) A horse can only be entered in one breed class.
- 17) Stallions shall not be shown at halter or under saddle by any person aged 18 years or under. Proof of age of handler will be required. Stallions shall not be shown in any Junior Handler Class.
- 18) Handlers are not to incite horses on the Showgrounds. Any incident observed by any Show Official or Society Councillor which is considered to reflect abuse or cruel practice to an exhibit may result in immediate disqualification from all events in which that exhibit is entered.
- 19) All Protests must be in writing and lodged with the Secretary within one hour of the alleged violation, accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00 which shall be refunded only if the Protest is upheld. The decision of the Protests Committee shall be final.
- 20) All National Trophies will be subject to a "Bond" of \$100.00 prior to being collected from the Show Secretary. The bond is fully refundable the following year if the trophy is returned in an undamaged condition.
- 21) Excessive Use of the Whip will result in the handler being required to leave the ring on the instructions of the Ring Steward or Judge.
- 22) Horses with Whip or Welt Marks will not be judged.
- 23) Biting of Stallions or Colts is optional.
- 24) Foals shall not be shown in halters with chains. Chains may be captured or substituted with a leather (or equivalent) strap under the jaw.
- 25) Prohibited Substance testing may take place. Prohibited substance (drug) means any substance affecting the performance or the behaviour of a horse by its action on the central or peripheral nervous system, the cardiovascular system, the musculoskeletal system or the urogenital system.
- 26) Random Swabbing of an exhibit may occur at the discretion of the NZAHBS Show Committee. In the event of a positive result, the exhibit will be disqualified from any further classes and will forfeit any awards gained. Taking of specimens: every exhibitor shall, upon request of a Show Official, permit a specimen of blood, urine or saliva or other substance to be taken from their exhibit for testing. Refusal to comply may result in disqualification from the applicable show.
- 27) Artificial Markings – any change of colour or markings other than mane, tail or hoof is prohibited. These include artificial (painted) stars on foreheads, where no white hair exists.
- 28) Hats & Safety Helmets – a hard hat is generally described as a hunting cap, a bowler, protective headwear or a safety helmet. All riders 16 years and under must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting ring or anywhere else on the showgrounds. It is strongly recommended that all riders, particularly those jumping horses, wear protective headgear conforming to the current NZ Safety Standard or an equivalent standard, and that the headgear be secured by a retention harness.
- 29) The NZAHBS National Show Committee will not be responsible for any accident loss or damage that may be caused to, or suffered by any exhibit, person or property, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Committee indemnified against any claim in respect of any such accident, loss or damage.

PLEASE NOTE

- All Led Classes (except Quality/Classic Head, Quality/Classic Action), Ridden Classes (except Best Presented, Best Rider, Best Trotting) and the Costume Class will be run as Qualifying Heats.
- Horses will be judged and called out in numerical order and given a Qualifying Ribbon.
- The Qualifying Ribbon then qualifies the horse for the Top 3/Top 5 Presentation (depending on entry numbers).
- Top 3/Top 5 qualifying horses go forward for Champion of their respective section. Reserve Champion will be selected from the remaining qualifying horses.
- Championships will be awarded progressively throughout the programme and will follow the relative Top 3/Top 5 Presentation.
