RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY 2024

- 1) The New Zealand Arabian Horse Society Rules for Judging & Showing Arabian Horses apply to all classes and all sections and will be strictly enforced. Competitors, exhibitors, owners and handlers should familiarise themselves with the rules of this event which are available on request or to download from the NZAHS website: www.newzealandarabs.com.
- 2) The age of all horses is to be calculated as from 1st August. Every horse foaled before 1st August in any year shall be deemed to be one year old on that date (this includes imported horses).
- 3) Horses to be shown must be registered with the New Zealand Arabian Horse Society (Inc) or in the case of Purebred foals, be eligible for registration. Eligibility is defined as being: that the sire and dam of the foal are DNA'd at the time of close of entries for the show and that the breeder/exhibitor is, through full and current financial membership of the NZAHS, eligible to register the foal that is being entered for the show.
- 4) Imported horses may not be shown until New Zealand registration (including DNA information) is completed and a certificate issued.
- 5) All horses shown must be registered with the New Zealand Arabian Horse Society (Inc) and exhibited in the name of the bona fide owner or lessee. All leases must be registered with the New Zealand Arabian Horse Society (Inc).
- 6) **Mare Class Definitions (Purebred & Derivative):**
 - **Dry Mare:** A mare that is not in foal and has not been covered in the current season.
 - **Wet/Broodmare:** A mare that has a foal at foot or has foaled and weaned a foal in the current show season. Proof that she has foaled or lost a foal in the current show season may be required. A Wet/Broodmare cannot compete in Ridden Sections.
 - **In-foal Mare:** A mare that has been covered in the current season and has a positive pregnancy test. A vet certificate of proof of mare being in foal (minimum 15 day scan) may be required.
 - Mares may be shown in one class only.
- 7) **ENTRIES**

Entry Fees will be accepted by bank deposit only. Payment to accompany entries OR payment plans can be arranged with the Show Secretary on request with full entry fees to be paid by 16 January 2024.

For all classes the full NZAHS registered Name of the Horse, NZAHS Stud Book Number, Sex, Date of Birth, Breeder, Sire and Dam must appear on the Official Entry Form.

NO LATE ENTRIES OR ENTRIES ON SHOW DAY WILL BE ACCEPTED
- 8) **Stables/Covered Yards** – to be pre-ordered and pre-paid using the Official Stable Order Form included with the schedule and forwarded to the Show Secretary with entry fees. \$20.00 per night. Stables/Yards must be left clean and tidy. All horses must be either stabled/yarded while on the showgrounds. Stallions/Colts must be stabled. Stallions/Colts/Mares with foals will be given first priority for stabling. The stables steward can request that any unruly or unhealthy horse be removed from the stabling/yarding area to another area.
- 9) **Camping** – \$20 per night per vehicle.
- 10) **Refunds** – there will be no refund of entry fees in any circumstances, except 75% on presentation of a Doctors/Veterinary Certificate of unfitness on the day of the show. The Doctors/Veterinary Certificate must be forwarded to the Show Secretary on or before the day of the show. Refunds will be processed after the show.
- 11) Judging will be in accordance with the New Zealand Arabian Horse Society Rules for Judging & Showing Arabian Horses.
- 12) The NZ National Show (NI) Committee reserves the right to make any alterations to the programme or to postpone or cancel the show or any class as it sees fit. If there are insufficient entries in classes, classes may be combined. This will be advised before the first class is judged. For example, Native Costume and Show Costume classes may be combined.
- 13) Exhibitors must be ready to enter the ring when the class is called in catalogue order. No late exhibitors may enter the ring if Judging has commenced.
- 14) A height certificate is required for any class with a height stipulation. Competitors must be able to produce on request a Life Certificate or certificate issued in the current show season.
- 15) Horses must be 3 years and over in all Ridden classes.

- 16) Entries in Gelding classes must have been gelded. Registration Certificate to be produced on request.
- 17) A horse can only be entered in one breed class.
- 18) **One horse/one handler & one horse/one rider permitted per class.** It is on the onus of the handler/rider with more than one horse eligible for a championship to nominate the horse they will lead/ride and organise further rider(s)/handler(s) for any other eligible horse(s).
- 19) Stallions shall not be shown at halter or under saddle by any person aged 18 years or under. Proof of age of handler will be required. Stallions shall not be shown in any Amateur Handler or Youth classes.
- 20) Any incident observed by any Show Official or NZAHS Councillor which is considered to reflect abuse or cruel practice to an exhibit may result in immediate disqualification from all events in which that exhibit is entered.
- 21) **All** competitors must conduct themselves in a good sporting manner. Failure to do so will result in being eliminated from participating in any more events on the day in question if there is a complaint made against their behaviour and protest lodged. The committee at its absolute discretion also may refuse entry or cancel any entry already accepted or decline to admit to the show grounds or remove any animal, exhibitor or person from the said grounds.
- 22) **All** persons entering the show grounds must conduct themselves in a good sporting manner, failure to do so will result in removal from the grounds.
- 23) Novice Rider/Horse/Pony – is one that is yet to win six (6) classes in any division within the competitions provided by any all Arabian Breed Show or A&P Show. A NZAHS Performance Card and/or RAS Certificate must be carried and produced on request by any authorised Show Official. Any competitor unable to produce such Card or Certificate means the exhibit is ineligible to compete and will forfeit any awards. The number of Novice wins is to be counted at the time of the Show, not the time of entry. If a Novice entry exceeds the permitted number of wins by the day of the Show, the competitor must advise the Show Secretary. Snaffle bridles only for novice events. Novice can enter open classes.
- 24) Horses that get loose in the ring may not be disqualified provided that:
 - a) They do not leave the ring
 - b) They can be caught quickly without delaying the class in progress
 - c) Do not pose a danger to other competitors or the publicThe final decision as to whether a horse is or is not disqualified shall rest with the Judge and shall be final.
- 25) All Protests must be in writing and lodged with the Show Secretary within one hour of the alleged violation, accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00 which shall be refunded only if the Protest is upheld. The decision of the Protests Committee shall be final.
- 26) National Trophies, if available for release, will be subject to a "Bond" of \$100.00 payable to the NZAHS prior to being collected from the Show Secretary. The bond is fully refundable the following year if the trophy is returned to the NZAHS undamaged, cleaned and engraved.
- 27) Excessive Use of the Whip/Chain will result in the handler being required to leave the ring on the instructions of the Ring Steward, Gate Steward or Judge.
- 28) Horses with Whip or Welt Marks will not be judged.
- 29) Bitting of Stallions or Colts is optional.
- 30) Foals shall not be shown in halters with chains. Chains may be captured or substituted with a leather (or equivalent) strap under the jaw.
- 31) Prohibited Substance testing may take place. Prohibited substance (drug) means any substance affecting the performance or the behaviour of a horse by its action on the central or peripheral nervous system, the cardiovascular system, the musculoskeletal system or the urogenital system.
- 32) Random Swabbing of an exhibit may occur at the discretion of the Show Officials. In the event of a positive result, the exhibit will be disqualified from any further classes and will forfeit any awards gained. Taking of specimens: every exhibitor shall, upon request of a Show Official, permit a specimen of blood, urine or saliva or other substance to be taken from their exhibit for testing. Refusal to comply may result in disqualification from the show.
- 33) Artificial Markings – any change of colour or markings other than mane, tail or hoof is prohibited. These include artificial (painted) stars on foreheads, where no white hair exists.
- 34) Safety Helmets – all riders must wear an approved safety helmet that complies with the safety standards accepted by Equestrian Sport New Zealand (ESNZ), New Zealand Pony Clubs Association (NZPCA) and the Royal A&P Society of New Zealand (RAS). Such helmets shall be tagged with a compliant visible yellow tag. Any rider whose helmet is not appropriately tagged will not be permitted to enter the ring.
- 35) Amateur Handler/Rider: An Amateur is one who, regardless of his equestrian skills and/or accomplishments, in the past three years has not directly or indirectly accepted as payment, goods or money for services usually provided by a professional in the areas of breaking, riding, training, schooling, driving, halter preparation, showing in halter or under saddle. The following activities shall not affect the Amateur status of a person who is otherwise qualified: a) The writing of books; b) Accepting remuneration for judging or stewarding; c) Speaking at workshops, clinics,

seminars or training days in a voluntary capacity where they do not accept a fee for their services; d) Receiving prize money or goods/services as prizes; e) Having the occupation of farrier, veterinarian, stable hand or groom; f) Owning or operating a saddlery, stud or breeding farm or boarding stables.

Spouses and immediate family of a trainer are also able to be classed as Amateur, as long as they are not involved with the breaking, training, schooling, riding or showing of any of the horses the trainer is being paid to work. The Amateur Handler/Rider is not required to own the horse that they show. No coaching, verbal instructions or signals are to be given from the sideline or in the Marshalling area whilst awaiting the class.

- 36) The NZ National Show (NI) Committee or NZAHS will not be responsible for any accident loss or damage that may be caused to, or suffered by any exhibit, person or property, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Show Officials and NZAHS indemnified against any claim in respect of any such accident, loss or damage.
- 37) **NO DOGS** – this is a venue rule. Any person with a dog will be disqualified and forfeit all entry fees.
- 38) No tie downs to be used in any ridden classes. No bitless bridles
- 39) No temporary tape fences to be erected on the grounds
- 40) All chains on inhand halters must be caught or have a leather guard.
- 41) Youth ridden, snaffle bridle only. No spurs, no dressage whips. Youth classes – 18yrs and under

PLEASE NOTE

- Exhibitors must be ready for their class/classes in catalogue order when the class is called. No late exhibitors may enter the ring if judging has commenced.
- All Led Breed Classes (excluding novelty classes ie Quality/Classic Head, Trotting, NZ Bred, Progeny etc) ,Ridden Classes (except Best Presented, Trot) , Amateur To Handle, Handler Classes and Costume Classes will be run as Qualifying Heats.
- Horses will be judged and called out in numerical order and given a Qualifying Ribbon.
- The Qualifying Ribbon then qualifies the horse for the Championship.
- Top 3 Sashes are dependent on section numbers. 5 entries or less: Champion, Reserve Champion and 1 x Top 3 sash. 6 entries or more: Champion, Reserve Champion and 3 x Top 3 sashes.
- Championships will be awarded progressively throughout the programme.
