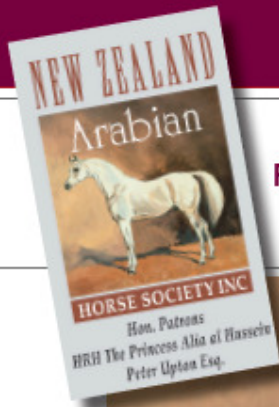

YOUTH RIDDEN (classes 76 to 81) will be the first classes after lunch

DERIVATIVE RIDDEN followed by PUREBRED RIDDEN

This event is run under the NZAHS Rules for Judging & Showing Arabian Horses. Competitors, exhibitors, owners and handlers should familiarise themselves with the rules of this event.

SPECIAL PUREBRED AWARDS

- Gold Star Champion Purebred Mare & Runner-Up Silver Star Champion Mare: to be judged on points gained for placings in classes 61, 62, 63, 98, 99, 100, 103, 104, 105, 106 & 107. The winner will receive \$750.00 and a Gold Star Champion Sash, the Runner-up will receive \$250.00 and a Silver Star Sash.
- Gold Star Champion Purebred Gelding & Runner-Up Silver Star Champion Gelding: to be judged on points gained for placings in classes 58, 59, 60, 98, 99, 101, 103, 104, 105, 106 & 107. The winner will receive \$750.00 and a Gold Star Champion Sash, the Runner-up will receive \$250.00 and a Silver Star Sash.
- To be eligible to compete for these awards a \$25.00 nomination fee is required.

HI-POINT YOUTH AWARD

- The Youth Led and Ridden Sections will be run on a cumulative points system whereby place ribbons will be awarded and points allocated as: 1st place (six points), 2nd place (five points), 3rd place (four points), 4th place (three points), 5th place (two points), 6th place (one point).
- Overall Hi-Point Sashes for 1st–6th place will be presented following the Youth Ridden Section.
- All Youth Class entry fees are \$5.00 per class

RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY 2020

- 1) The New Zealand Arabian Horse Society Rules for Judging & Showing Arabian Horses apply to all classes and all sections and will be strictly enforced. Competitors, exhibitors, owners and handlers should familiarise themselves with the rules of this event which are available on request or to download from the NZAHS website: www.newzealandarabs.com.
- 2) The age of all horses is to be calculated as from 1st August. Every horse foaled before 1st August in any year shall be deemed to be one year old on that date (this includes imported horses).
- 3) Horses to be shown must be registered with the New Zealand Arabian Horse Society (Inc) or in the case of Purebred foals, be eligible for registration. Eligibility is defined as being: that the sire and dam of the foal are DNA'd at the time of close of entries for the show and that the breeder/exhibitor is, through full and current financial membership of the NZAHS, eligible to register the foal that is being entered for the show.
- 4) Imported horses may not be shown until New Zealand registration (including DNA information) is completed and a certificate issued.
- 5) All horses shown must be registered with the New Zealand Arabian Horse Society (Inc) and exhibited in the name of the bona fide owner or lessee. All leases must be registered with the New Zealand Arabian Horse Society (Inc).
- 6) **Mare Class Definitions (Purebred & Derivative):**
 - **Dry Mare:** A mare that is not in foal and has not been covered in the current season.
 - **Wet/Broodmare:** A mare that has a foal at foot or has foaled and weaned a foal in the current show season. Proof that she has foaled or lost a foal in the current show season may be required.
 - **In-foal Mare:** A mare that has been covered in the current season and has a positive pregnancy test. A vet certificate of proof of mare being in foal (minimum 15 day scan) may be required.
 - Mares may be shown in one class only.

7) ENTRIES

Entry Fees will be accepted by bank deposit or cheque. Payment to accompany entries OR payment plans can be arranged with the Show Secretary on request with full entry fees to be paid by 10 January 2020.

For all classes the full NZAHS registered Name of the Horse, NZAHS Stud Book Number, Sex, Date of Birth, Breeder, Sire and Dam must appear on the Official Entry Form.

NO LATE ENTRIES OR ENTRIES ON SHOW DAY WILL BE ACCEPTED

- 8) **Back Numbers/Number Holders** – to be worn by either horse or rider/handler. Exhibitors please supply your own back numbers as these will not be provided.
- 9) **Stables** – to be pre-ordered and pre-paid using the Official Stable Order Form included with the schedule and forwarded to the Show Secretary with entry fees. \$30.00 per night, 3 nights for \$90.00, 4+ nights no additional charge.
- 10) **Camping** – can be arranged directly with the Canterbury Agricultural Park caretaker, Dugald Thomas, telephone: 03 343 3107.
- 11) **Refunds** – there will be no refund of entry fees in any circumstances, except 75% on presentation of a Doctors/Veterinary Certificate of unfitness on the day of the show. The Doctors/Veterinary Certificate must be forwarded to the Show Secretary on or before the day of the show. Refunds will be processed after the show.
- 12) Judging will be in accordance with the New Zealand Arabian Horse Society Rules for Judging & Showing Arabian Horses.
- 13) The Otago Arabian Horse Club reserves the right to make any alterations to the programme or to postpone or cancel the show or any class as it sees fit. If there are insufficient entries in classes, classes may be combined. This will be advised before the first class is judged. For example, Native Costume and Show Costume classes may be combined.
- 14) Exhibitors must be ready to enter the ring when the class is called in catalogue order. No late exhibitors may enter the ring if Judging has commenced.
- 15) A height certificate is required for any class with a height stipulation. Competitors must be able to produce on request a Life Certificate or certificate issued in the current show season.
- 16) Horses must be 3 years and over in all Ridden classes.

- 17) Entries in Gelding classes must have been gelded. Registration Certificate to be produced on request.
- 18) A horse can only be entered in one breed class.
- 19) One horse/one handler & one horse/one rider permitted per class. It is on the onus of the handler/rider with more than one horse eligible for a championship to nominate the horse they will lead/ride and organise further rider(s)/handler(s) for any other eligible horse(s).
- 20) Stallions shall not be shown at halter or under saddle by any person aged 18 years or under. Proof of age of handler will be required. Stallions shall not be shown in any Amateur Handler or Youth classes.
- 21) Handlers are not to incite horses on the Showgrounds. Any incident observed by any Show Official or NZAHS Councillor which is considered to reflect abuse or cruel practice to an exhibit may result in immediate disqualification from all events in which that exhibit is entered.
- 22) Novice Rider/Horse/Pony – is one that is yet to win six (6) classes in any division within the competitions provided by any all Arabian Breed Show or A & P Show.
- 23) Horses that get loose in the ring may not be disqualified provided that:
 - a) They do not leave the ring
 - b) They can be caught quickly without delaying the class in progress
 - c) Do not pose a danger to other competitors or the public
 The final decision as to whether a horse is or is not disqualified shall rest with the Judge and shall be final.
- 24) All Protests must be in writing and lodged with the Show Secretary within one hour of the alleged violation, accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00 which shall be refunded only if the Protest is upheld. The decision of the Protests Committee shall be final.
- 25) National Trophies, if available for release, will be subject to a "Bond" of \$100.00 payable to the NZAHS prior to being collected from the Show Secretary. The bond is fully refundable the following year if the trophy is returned to the NZAHS undamaged, cleaned and engraved.
- 26) Excessive Use of the Whip will result in the handler being required to leave the ring on the instructions of the Ring Steward or Judge.
- 27) Horses with Whip or Welt Marks will not be judged.
- 28) Biting of Stallions or Colts is optional.
- 29) Foals shall not be shown in halters with chains. Chains may be captured or substituted with a leather (or equivalent) strap under the jaw.
- 30) Prohibited Substance testing may take place. Prohibited substance (drug) means any substance affecting the performance or the behaviour of a horse by its action on the central or peripheral nervous system, the cardiovascular system, the musculoskeletal system or the urogenital system.
- 31) Random Swabbing of an exhibit may occur at the discretion of the Show Officials. In the event of a positive result, the exhibit will be disqualified from any further classes and will forfeit any awards gained. Taking of specimens: every exhibitor shall, upon request of a Show Official, permit a specimen of blood, urine or saliva or other substance to be taken from their exhibit for testing. Refusal to comply may result in disqualification from the show.
- 32) Artificial Markings – any change of colour or markings other than mane, tail or hoof is prohibited. These include artificial (painted) stars on foreheads, where no white hair exists.
- 33) Safety Helmets – all riders must wear an approved safety helmet that complies with the safety standards accepted by Equestrian Sport New Zealand (ESNZ), New Zealand Pony Clubs Association (NZPCA) and the Royal A&P Society of New Zealand (RAS). Such helmets shall be tagged with a compliant visible red tag. Any rider whose helmet is not appropriately tagged will not be permitted to enter the ring.
- 34) Amateur Handler/Rider: An Amateur is one who, regardless of his equestrian skills and/or accomplishments, in the past three years has not directly or indirectly accepted as payment, goods or money for services usually provided by a professional in the areas of breaking, riding, training, schooling, driving, halter preparation, showing in halter or under saddle. The following activities shall not affect the Amateur status of a person who is otherwise qualified:
 - a) The writing of books;
 - b) Accepting remuneration for judging or stewarding;
 - c) Speaking at workshops, clinics, seminars or training days in a voluntary capacity where they do not accept a fee for their services;
 - d) Receiving prize money or goods/services as prizes;
 - e) Having the occupation of farrier, veterinarian, stable hand or groom;
 - f) Owning or operating a saddlery, stud or breeding farm or boarding stables.

Spouses and immediate family of a trainer are also able to be classed as Amateur, as long as they are not involved with the breaking, training, schooling, riding or showing of any of the horses the trainer is being paid to work. The Amateur Handler/Rider is not required to own the horse that they show. No coaching, verbal instructions or signals are to be given from the sideline or in the Marshalling area whilst awaiting the class.
- 35) The Otago Arabian Horse Club or NZAHS will not be responsible for any accident loss or damage that may be caused to, or suffered by any exhibit, person or property, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Show Officials and NZAHS indemnified against any claim in respect of any such accident, loss or damage.

36) **NO DOGS** – this is a venue rule. Any person with a dog will be disqualified and forfeit all entry fees.

PLEASE NOTE

- Exhibitors must be ready for their class/classes in catalogue order, when the class is called. No late exhibitors may enter the ring if judging has commenced.
- The only horses allowed in the inside collecting area are those waiting for the next class. All other horses must wait outside until their class is called.
- All Led Classes (except Best Presented, Quality/Classic Head, Best Walking, Best Trotting) and Ridden Classes (except Best Presented, Best Rider) and the Costume Class will be run as Qualifying Heats.
- Novice classes are also qualifying classes – horses will be awarded 1st to 4th place ribbons and the judge shall also award a Qualifying Ribbon to those horses to go forward for the Top 3 Presentation.
- Horses will be judged and called out in numerical order and given a Qualifying Ribbon.
- The Qualifying Ribbon then qualifies the horse for the Top 3 Presentation.
- Top 3 qualifying horses go forward for Champion of their respective section. Reserve Champion will be selected from the remaining qualifying horses.
- Championships will be awarded progressively throughout the programme and will follow the relative Top 3 Presentation.
